A Hong Kong series of 50 radiographs was lodged in the Repository for this lot.

Left Fore Hoof: No significant findings.  
Left Fore Fetlock: There is a 16.5 x 2.5mm smooth callous on the distodorsal cannon bone proximal to the fetlock joint.  
Left Fore Knee: No significant findings.  
Right Fore Hoof: No significant findings.  
Right Fore Fetlock: No significant findings.  
Right Fore Knee: No significant findings.  
Left Hind Fetlock: No significant findings.  
Left Hind Hock: No significant findings.  
Left Hind Stifle: No significant findings.  
Right Hind Fetlock: No significant findings.  
Right Hind Hock: No significant findings.  
Right Hind Stifle: No significant findings.

Comment: Rating this horse as a low, moderate or high risk to develop lameness in one of the radiographed joints or areas I would currently rate this horse as a **low** risk.

Video Endoscopy: An examination of the video endoscopy performed by Dr Tate Morris of the Randwick Equine Centre on the 11/10/24 revealed the horse to be primarily displaying Lane grade 1 laryngeal function which is considered normal. No abnormalities were detected.

Clinical examination: The clinical included heart, ophthalmic eye examination, teeth examination, limb flexion and joint palpation which were normal. The horse was examined at rest and at the walk. There was no evidence of previous abdominal surgery, infection or disease, lameness, laminitis or ataxia. The horse was sound at the walk and at the handled trot.

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
